

Town Board Meeting; September 15, 2025

*Minutes subject to corrections/changes until approved by Town Board.

BOARD PRESENT: Chair Kevin Timm, Supervisors Chad Morris & Daren Schieldt

STAFF PRESENT: Clerk Jill Murphy

Call to Order: Chair Timm called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Notices were posted.

Minutes: Motion made by Morris/Schieldt to approve minutes of the August 11 town board mtg. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's August financial report was presented by clerk. Motion by Morris/Schieldt to approve. **Motion** carried.

Shelby Fire Dept.: Schieldt stated the dept. is in need of personnel; any one 18 and over can join and certifications will be paid for. Chief Tony Holinka gave an update on dept. Invited to EMS Commission mtg. to talk about rural EMS. Received communication about pre-construction mtg. on County Rd. OA. Will be meeting with Wayne Nagy, from Mathy Construction regarding asphalt plant in Town of Washington; do a lot of mutual aid in area and will get plant tour. Call volume increasing; on pace for 480 calls this yr; highest ever was 423 two yrs. ago. Median in route time for medical calls in Aug. was 3m34s, fire calls 1m56s (skewed for fire due to already being on standby). Time from alarm (page) to arrival (on scene) for fire is 10m10s, medical 10m45s. Have enough people on dept. but only 4 people responding to fire station in Greenfield; need more personnel in St. Joe's area. Applications on Shelby website/bulletin board Greenfield Hall entry. 18 calls in Aug. with 3 EMS/1 fire in Greenfield.

Household Livestock Ordinance (chickens): Timm read thru the amended ordinance. Nick Schams stated he is worried about the smell and property owners not being responsible enough. Schieldt said the ordinance states that the town has the right to discontinue ordinance if issues arise. Timm stated all the board members contact info. is on the website and please reach out if needed. Timm read the email response from the DNR regarding opinion of having chickens in the sanitary district. Stated waste run-off could get into the sewer system and add to higher levels of phosphorus esp. during rain/storms, but as long as waste is properly disposed of, doesn't see a reason why property owners couldn't have chickens. Motion by Morris/Schieldt to approve amended ordinance. Motion carried.

Update on county building purchase; W2715 State Hwy 33: Proposal price of \$100,000 was accepted by the county; working with county to have a soil test done, hope to have purchase completed by 1 ½ months. Working on getting bids for a new roof.

Roads & Equipment: Work on Bendel Rd. off Ober Rd. is done and all road work for the year is completed.

*Citizen Concerns: Terry Mans from Brookview mobile home court stated he concerned about the run-off from Ten Mile Hill which has led to the erosion of the creek banks thus affecting the stability of his mobile home. Has tried contacting park management and the DNR. Timm stated he will contact someone at La Crosse County to look into the situation. Clerk stated may miss October mtg. Nancy Kroner announced there will be a blood drive at the town hall on Monday, October 6 from 1-6 pm. Food is served to donors by very nice volunteers! Please give if you can; blood is very much needed. Thank you.

Motion made by Morris/Schieldt to adjourn. Motion carried. Adjourned at 6:56 p.m.
